Paul is a former U.S. Army ranger and infantry officer. He attended law school on an army scholarship, graduated summa cum laude from Indiana University in Bloomington in 2005, and then served as a JAG attorney for six years, including two tours in Afghanistan. After leaving the army, Paul clerked for Judge Neil M. Gorsuch (now a Justice of the United States Supreme Court) before earning his MBA from Duke's Fuqua School of Business and going into private practice. Since then, Paul successfully prosecuted **Does v. Cooper**, a federal lawsuit which struck down much of North Carolina's previous premises restrictions, and is currently lead counsel for NARSOL's legal challenge to the North Carolina registration laws, **Does v. Stein**. Paul serves as NARSOL's attorney and general counsel.
